Law Versus Opinion

We live in a society that is very different than most other countries in the world. The levels of freedoms that we enjoy makes us the envy of many oppressed souls.

We see in the Declaration of Independence the following: "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness.--That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, ..."

We see the purpose of government is for the securing of these rights.

Article. I. Section. 1. Of the United States Constitution says, "All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives."

Webster's American Dictionary of the English Language, online, gives the following definition.

Legislative, adjective 1. Giving or enacting laws; as a legislative body. 2. Capable of enacting laws; as legislative power. 3. Pertaining to the enacting of laws; suitable to laws; as legislative style. 4. Done by enacting; as a legislative act. So in our system of separate powers, it is not the job of the Executive or The Judicial branches of government to make laws.

It is clearly the job of the Congress to make any and all such laws. Unfortunately, we have seen a perversion of our system in that the Supreme Court is legislating from the bench.

One of the remarkable details of our system of government is that we can elect the legislators, thereby we have accountability. In the case of the Supreme court, the justices are appointed, lifetime I may add, and therefore we are unable to safeguard any legislative actions they take.

Our forefathers, in their wisdom, knew this and created a system to protect us. That is why the Supreme Court, or any part of the judicial branch of government, has absolutely no constitutional authority to make any law.

In the matter of Roe Verses Wade, there was never law, only the opinion of the Court. It was the opinion of the Court that a woman had the right to have an abortion if the fetus was not viable, or able to live outside the womb.

I know that most, if not all of our church people share the opinion that a baby in the womb is alive and is precious. One may ask why even write this article when we all probably agree completely on this subject.

My answer is that we will be facing this issue in conversations with other people in the coming weeks. The feeling that the

Supreme Court will be changing its opinion on the matter of abortion has already sparked protests across our nation.

Luke 1:41 tells us, "And it came to pass, that, when Elisabeth heard the salutation of Mary, the babe leaped in her womb; and Elisabeth was filled with the Holy Ghost:" The Bible, God's Holy Word, calls the unborn a babe.

Psalm 139:13-14, "For thou hast possessed my reins: thou hast covered me in my mother's womb. I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made: marvellous are thy works; and that my soul knoweth right well." Me is a personal pronoun, and we are wonderfully made.

Jeremiah 1:5, "Before I formed thee in the belly I knew thee; and before thou camest out of the womb I sanctified thee, and I ordained thee a prophet unto the nations."

Understand that the Almighty God, the Creator of the Universe, creates us and has a purpose for us.

Psalm 127:3, "Lo, children are an heritage of the lord: and the fruit of the womb is his reward."

Job 31:15, "Did not he that made me in the womb make him? And did not one fashion us in the womb?"

These are just a few of the scriptures that show we have an identity while in the womb, it is a child in the womb.

The argument that is presented from the secular point of view is that we are taking away women's right. Quite frankly, a woman's right ends where another's right begins. A woman has no more right to kill a baby because it is inside her body than I have a right to kill someone because they are in my house.

We must sadly remember that with every successful abortion, I use the word successful with remorse, someone dies and about half are female.

The next point of attack usually starts with , "What if..." And then we have some situational details given. My question is, what if we decided to follow God and surrender to his will?

"I Was Just Thinkin'"

"Full Surrender"

A couple was just returning home from vacation. It was around 9pm and not only were they exhausted, but the wife had been sick the whole trip. Work loomed ahead early the next morning so she went on to bed.

Just as sleep was overtaking her, she heard her husband frantically hollering from the kitchen. She rushed to his side to see their 10 year old cat Rudy with his head stuck in the disposal. The headless cat was frantically clawing the slick sink hoping to free himself.

The husband had disposed of some fish earlier and the temptation to possibly retrieve a snack was too much for Rudy.

She calmed the terrified pet while her husband attempted to dismantle the disposal.

To add to the chaos, their other cat was jumping in and out of the sink, licking Rudy's head for comfort, then biting his bottom out of fear. This definitely did not help matters.

Unable to take apart the disposal they tried greasing Rudy's head with Crisco and shampoo, hoping it would slip out but to no avail.

After exhausting all their ideas, they decided they needed professional help. At 11:00pm they began making calls: their plumber (no answer), the disposal company number (no answer), a 24 hour pest removal service (no answer), and finally 911 as poor Rudy's pink paw pads were turning a dusky shade of blue.

It was now midnight and two very caring and concerned officers arrived at the scene. One had the idea to use a saw to cut the plastic flange around Rudy's head. The bottom of the unit came off, revealing Rudy's head and allowing him to breath., but the plastic ring couldn't be cut without endangering their frightened pet.

The other officer suggested that they take

the sink out; lay it on its side and that would allow them to free pitiful Rudy.

Plumbing lines were capped off, pipes unscrewed, and within an hour the sink was removed. Laying the sink on the side offered no solution, Rudy was still stuck.

The next plan of action was to get Rudy to a veterinary clinic to sedate him. If he were limp surely he could be removed.

The officer offered to lead them to the clinic. The wife gets in the back seat with Rudy and the kitchen sink and the husband drives.

It was now 2:00 a.m. Rudy was not in good shape, his temperature was low and his oxygen level was half of what it should be. The vet announcing he was in shock, sedated him, and covered his neck and head with K-Y Jelly. Immediately Rudy's head slipped out of its sink prison.

The couple went to the lobby while the staff frantically worked to save Rudy. At 3am the doctor came to the lobby to tell them he would be fine and could come home in a couple of days.

Rudy's little adventure cost them \$1100 in ER vet bills, follow up visits, a new sink and plumbing, new electrical wiring, and a new garbage disposal with a cover! A pretty valuable little kitty considering they got him for free!

As is probably obvious to everyone, is that if Rudy had just yielded and surrendered to those trying the help him the problem would have been resolved in the beginning.

Neither the stubborn kitty nor his owners would have had to suffer and gone through so much.

Oh how Rudy reminded me of my life and the times I fought against surrendering something in my life to God. I vividly remember the cost, pain and

ordeal I went through by fighting His choice.

I know there are times I was resisting God and did not even realize I was. Could this be the case with you too?

To be totally surrendered to God we must not only want God to accomplish His will in our life, but we must also have a passionate desire to fulfill His will.

Do you see the difference? If we only want God to work His purpose we are saying, "Okay, I am resigned to whatever you want."

While this is all fine and good I think we need to go a step further. When we want personally to carry out His wishes we then become a part of His divine design.

This makes us partners with God rather than spectators in His great work. Whatever we claim as our own ambition aspires us to greater commitment and effort.

Be sure of one thing, once you truly want to work hand in hand with God your dedication will be tried. Circumstances will very possibly take a frightening turn.

You say you surrender all, but what happens when it looks like those people and things dearest to your heart may be taken, harmed, or made to suffer?

Will you still want to fulfill His will? Times such as this are true testing grounds as we find we really weren't ready to hand everything over to God.

At this point we will all come to this fork in the road. We will choose one of two things; realize we haven't actually entrusted Him with all we have and willingly put everything in His hands or we begin to fight against the Lord, refusing to accept His way.

The first way, turning it all over to Him will seem the hardest way, but in reality it is the easiest. To take this path means we must acknowledge what we fear most and totally resign that possibility to God.

With this leap of faith, fears usually subside and we are overwhelmed with the assurance that God will only do what is best.

To take the second, longer way, means frustration, heartache, confusion and emotional turmoil.

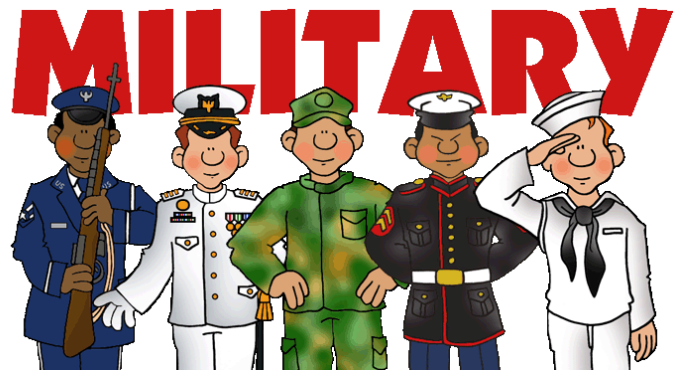

Legacy Missionaries Honored

Four missionary couples were recognized as the 2022 BMA Legacy Missionaries on Wednesday, April 20, in a ceremony at the BMA National Meeting in Springfield, MO.

These missionaries dedicated their lives to global missions and have impacted countless others.

Dr. John and Mrs. Shirley Ladd served in Mexico for 57 years. The Ladds constructed the Good Samaritan Clinic in Aquismon, Mexico, in 1978, and Dr. Ladd served as the medical director of the clinic until 2012.

The clinic is still serving the people of Mexico today and is staffed by local medical personnel.

Bro. Marvin and Mrs. Helen Loyd served throughout Nicaragua, Bolivia, and Guatemala from 1966 until 1993.

Their ministry included teaching school, volunteering in a medical clinic, assisting with church planting, flying supply planes to missionaries and locals, building a seminary, reaching primitive tribes, and more.

Bro. Dale and Mrs. Barbara Thornton served in Taiwan for 40 years.

The Thorntons moved to Taiwan in 1961 and worked alongside Jack and Latrell Bateman planting churches and discipling believers.

Although they faced multiple challenges, they remained faithful to God's calling, and God continued to bless their ministry even after they returned from the field in 2001.

Bro. Don and Mrs. Linda Newsom served in the Philippines from 1978 until God called them home to heaven. The Newsoms spent nearly half a century planting over 30 churches and caring for the children of their community.

Mrs. Linda passed away in 2012, and Bro. Don in 2021, and they are both buried in the country that they loved so well.

During the ceremony, President of Global Missions John David Smith posed this question: "How will you outlive your life?"

He shared that a legacy demands that we must live for things we are willing to die for, commit to others, and realize that we will not see the full effects of our efforts.

Smith stated, "In order to leave a legacy of eternal value after this life, we have to seek things of eternal value during this life."

The Ladds, Loyds, Thorntons, and Newsoms each leave a legacy in their respective fields as the Lord continues to work in the lives touched by these faithful men and women.

should be treated as such.

In all likelihood we will see individual states determine if or when an abortion will be allowed or legal. Conservative states will typically have much more restrictive laws and liberal states will allow more opportunity to obtain an abortion. Just as a point of reference, you will not find anywhere in the constitution that we have the right to take another life.

Another thing to consider is the cruel and barbaric manner in which abortions are performed. If we did to a puppy or a kitten what is done to a baby, we would be arrested for cruelty to an animal. Stay strong in the battle and stand for those who cannot stand for themselves.

On another note, primary season is upon us. One of the most difficult tasks that we have is "to weed through" the political ads and attacks to know who to vote for.

Latest News From Grace Harbor

May was quite an exciting and eventful month. We welcomed four new covenant members into our church, and baptized one lady at our Family Sunday service.

Last weekend, we hosted our annual Summer Park Event in the local park, and saw around 100 folks come through. Prior to this event, our folks went through a night of training and encouragement in sharing their faith with the lost and praying for the needs of those we would come in contact with at the park.

At the event, several folks had the opportunity to share the Gospel with people they came in contact with.

Another really exciting development is that we have been able to come in contact with a community of Afghan Refugees living in very close proximity to our church.

There are about five Afghan families that we have the chance to meet who were forced to flee from Afghanistan in August of 2021.

Each of these families have several children.

I have personally been able to spend a lot of time with each of them, both in their homes (in a nearby apartment complex) and in taking them to the park and the grocery store.

There is a language barrier that makes communication a challenge, but God opens doors both through allowing technology to help communicate, and one of their 10 year sons having a familiarity with the English language.

Each of these families are devout Muslim families, and it is clear that our mission with them is to find ways to speak and share the Gospel with them.

They are incredibly generous and hospitable, so there are doors being opened!
