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## When Cinema Becomes “Sinema”

Those of us who are knowledgeable about the Bible know that God created the animals. One must now ask themselves, did society create Hollywood? Or did Hollywood create our current society? I am convinced that both are true.

The Bible tells us, “The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?” Jeremiah 17:9 KJV. So, mankind does have an innate evil that resides within us. This is why salvation is so important. It is abundantly clear, we need Jesus.

Without Christ, that wickedness will permeate through us and spread throughout society. We must remember 1 Thessalonians 5:22, “Abstain from all appearance of evil. And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.”

While scripture is abundantly clear, we oftentimes have great difficulty living this verse. Hopefully we all would agree that pornographic movies would be such as would be an obvious violation of scripture. Sadly, we have allowed societal norms to cloud our vision and understanding of scripture.

There are things that are clearly sins that we would not have tolerated as a society in the not so distant past.

If I had a dollar for each professing Christian that is a fan of the Harry Potter series, I would undoubtedly never have to work again. I imagine some that read this may even be upset by the mere mentioning of their beloved HP.

The Bible is very clear about the subject of witchcraft. Exodus 22:18 shows us how witches were dealt with in Old Testament Israel. “Thou shalt not suffer a witch to live.”

Leviticus 19:31 tells us, “Regard not them that have familiar spirits, neither seek after wizards to be defiled by them: I am the Lord your God.”

1 Samuel 15:23 tells us, “For rebellion is as the sin of witchcraft...”

Witchcraft is a sin, and we are forbidden to follow after such. So what society thinks is cute and harmless is actually wicked and sinful.

I hope by now we can all agree that being under the spell of a teenage wizard is totally unacceptable in God's eyes. But we push these iconic movies as wholesome family entertainment.

Cartoons are also destructive on influencing the behavior of our children. Beauty and the Beast, Snow White, and other such “classics” expose sinful behavior upon impressionable children.

Most of us would be offended if someone showed our children an X-rated movie. So why is it ok to glorify something else which God has declared a sin?

Be mindful that there is an attack on the minds of our children. It happens at the movies, on T.V. shows and even in the classrooms of schools. Parents need to protect their children from the attack that Satan is directing toward them.

So most of us would say the solution is to watch Christian movies and protect our children.

Now true Baptists have traditionally been very careful which church they attend or join and carefully check the doctrines. We might ask the pastor how the church celebrates the Lord's Supper, or maybe how many ordinances are in the church and if eternal security is taught.

Another big one is what are the qualifications of a bishop and does the church ordain women. Some of us that are “Super Spiritual” may even ask what type of music does the church use during service.

Occasionally we may even ask what version of the Bible is used.

So what about screening “Christian movies” to make sure they align doctrinally with the Bible.

As a pastor, sometimes I watch new “Christian” movies so I can let my congregation know if they are ok. So many times I find things that are either very uncomfortable or just downright unacceptable.

I recently watched *Left Behind, The Rise of the Antichrist* and saw some things presented that were not doctrinally correct. The view of when the seven year tribulation begins in relation to the Rapture is very suspect.

Perhaps the most disturbing false doctrine they teach is that people who rejected salvation can get saved during the Tribulation.

2 Thessalonians 2:10-12, “And with all deceivableness of unrighteousness in them that perish; because they received not the love of the truth, that they might be saved. And for this cause God shall send them strong delusion, that they should believe a lie: That they all might be damned who believed not the truth, but had pleasure in unrighteousness.”

Those that reject Jesus Christ before the Rapture will not get another chance after. We need to stop allowing false doctrine to continually influence our children, our families, and our churches.

You might say, “Is it that important that they showed people who rejected Christ

# "From the Pastor's Pen"

"Psalm 27"

Psalm 127

*A Song of degrees for Solomon.*

*Except the LORD build the house, they labour in vain that build it: except the LORD keep the city, the watchman waketh but in vain.*

*It is vain for you to rise up early, to sit up late, to eat the bread of sorrows: for so he giveth his beloved sleep.*

*Lo, children are an heritage of the LORD: and the fruit of the womb is his reward.*

*As arrows are in the hand of a mighty man; so are children of the youth. Happy is the man that hath his quiver full of them: they shall not be ashamed, but they shall speak with the enemies in the gate.*

The principle of this Psalm is that all human efforts are in vain unless they have God's blessings. This principle is applied to four areas:

**Building a house** [v.1a].

To labor in vain is useless. Speaking

spiritually, it will lack God's blessings.

**Guarding a city** [v. 1b].

Unless the Lord protects the city, sentries are useless.

**Working long hours** [v.2].

It is useless to toil from early morning until late at night, fearing you will starve, for God wants His loved ones to

get proper rest.

**Having children** [v.3-5].

Children are a gift of God, they are His reward. They are illustrated as arrows in a quiver which will be defenders of the family.

It is possible to accomplish all of these things without God's blessing, but it is not possible to accomplish them purposefully and with eternal value without God's blessing.

The Psalm includes, incidentally, two practical reasons for having children: They bring you joy and they protect you [v.5].

A grandmother shared the story of a pastor and his family that lived next door to her. As in times past, the congregation gave the preacher and his family clothing to help with their needs. Sadly, the church members donated their used clothing that was worn past use. Of course, this was not any help to the minister's family.

Finally, one Sunday morning, the pastor had his family actually wear some of the clothes that had been donated. The preacher stood in the pulpit preaching and his wife and children sat in the pew wearing ragged, torn, stained and dirty clothes.

Needless to say his flock was shocked and ashamed. How different it was to pack their useless leftovers in a box or bag and proudly take it to the preacher, thinking they had done their part, than to clearly see (and have others see) what they had really given.

People will donate stained t-shirts, ripped dresses and faded slacks to the clothing ministries and six year old cans of pumpkin to the food bank; things they would not otherwise use, and then expect to be thanked for their caring hearts and generosity.

Oh how their eyes would be opened if they saw the needy families wearing their rags to work and school, or hungry families sitting down to a meal of old canned pumpkin and beets. All those *'thoughtful'* donations would look shabby, wouldn't they?

*But he that doeth truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God.*

**John 3:21**

How often have we done the same thing to God? Let's look a little further, allowing God to turn His light on some other areas Christians tend to give the Lord their cast-offs.

What about your mind? **Matthew 22:37** gives us clear instruction as to what part of our minds belong to God. *"Jesus said unto*

*him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with ALL thy MIND."* Pretty clear, don't you think?

How much of your mind does God have? Satan has done an A #1 job of carving our minds up into countless pieces with his handy pocket knife called the "world": spouse, children, home, job, houses, cars, education, possessions, health, bills, finances, problems, worries, friends, hobbies, and activities. Each of these can be divided into many more parts. But where is God?

He never intended us to carry these burdens in life alone. He gave us protection against our minds being consumed with worry and anxiety, and that shield is called PRAYER. *"Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God." And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."*

**Philippians 4:6-7**

What are you putting into your mind? What material are you filling it with: romance novels, murder mysteries, magazines, newspapers, television shows – good and bad? While there is nothing wrong with some of these things, we need to ask ourselves, *"Am I filling my mind with more of these than I am God's Word?"*

We can't forget about our thought life. In **Philippians 4:8**, God gives us a standard against which to compare our thoughts. *"Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, , , honest. . . just, . . . pure, . . lovely. . . of good report."*

Now there's a quick checklist to evaluate how much of your mind is God's!

A few other "mind fillers" that squeeze God out are hatred, bitterness, resentment, jealousy, anger, and judgmentalness. If our minds are

constantly filled with ill thoughts toward others, there is unquestionably no room for Him. He tells us to have the same mind as Christ.

*Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:"*  
**Philippians 2:5**

It doesn't take a genius to know if something was a part of Christ's mind! In our hearts we know but we just don't want to admit it.

Take a look at your tongue.

When God saves us, He saves ALL of us. Yet somehow people seem to forget that includes their tongues and what they choose to say. God warns us that the tongue has the potential of being exceptionally sinful and evil.

*"And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity; so is the tongue among our members, that it defileth the whole body, and setteth on fire the course of nature, and it is set on fire of hell."* **James 3:6**

This Scripture makes it very clear that only with God's help and by His power can what comes out of our mouth be controlled. Who controls your tongue? If God isn't then you have given Satan free reign to your lips. It's really very simple, does what you say, the attitude you say it in, how you say it, and the motive behind what you say line up with God's Word?

Does it imitate Jesus, would He speak in that way? Usually we don't take the time to check and see; we just let our tongues lose with what ever pops into our hearts or minds. Many folks can't understand why they have problems with others, because they fail to see the *"deadly poison"* they are continually spewing on those around them.

*But the tongue can no man tame; it is an unruly evil, full of deadly poison."* **James 3:8**

One of first tongue offenses that come to mind with most is GOSSIP.

Do you share a person's failures and weaknesses with others; information that might shame them or damage their reputation?

Do you try to manipulate others into believing that a person is evil, dishonest, unfit, of poor character, by sharing sordid information about them?
