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### "Voluntary School Prayer"

Public expression through prayer of our faith in God is a fundamental part of our American heritage. Nearly every President has proclaimed an annual day of public prayer to acknowledge Almighty God.

We acknowledge God's guidance on our coinage, in our national anthem, and in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas stated in 1952, "We are a religious people whose institutions pre-suppose a Supreme Being."

If the U.S. Senate, the House of Representatives, all state legislatures, and even the U.S. Supreme Court can begin each day with prayer of religious invocations, why aren't public school children allowed the same privilege?

#### A Word from Our Nation's Capitol

After three years of effort, the Regan administration in early 1984 got its voluntary school prayer amendment before the U. S. Senate for a vote. The prayer amendment had popular support.

A June 1982 and January 1984 Gallup poll showed an average of 79 percent of the American public wanted to allow prayer in public schools, yet only 56 of 100 senators voted for it, 11 votes shy of the required two-thirds majority.

The major purpose of the prayer amendment was that the courts could not forbid children from voluntary vocal prayer in their school. It reasserted their liberty of free religious expression. It would ensure that no child would have been forced to

recite a prayer.

A Supreme Court decision, Widmar vs. Vincent, upheld the right of religious persons to meet on college campuses, but that right has not been expanded to high school and elementary students.

Madalyn Murray O'Hair was the one lady who challenged and won in the U.S. Supreme Court in 1963 and its ruling was directly responsible for abolishing school prayer. Since then her son has disclaimed her devilish efforts against God.

President Ronald Reagan in an address to broadcasters stated, "Neither should the freest country on earth ever have permitted God to be expelled from the school classrooms. When the Supreme Court ruled that school prayer was unconstitutional, I believe it ruled wrong."

Americans can be heard by writing your representatives to let them know how you feel.

#### A Word From Our States

A Texas school was deluged by several tornadoes, and to protect themselves, teachers and students were herded into the school gym, where they prayed out loud for their lives.

The school was entirely destroyed except for the gym, but the school principal was strongly reprimanded for praying aloud because school prayer in Texas is unconstitutional.

One New York (along with dozens of other states) lower court overacted holding the following verse recited by kindergarten children to be an establishment of religion: "We thank you for the flowers so sweet. We thank you for the food we eat. We thank you for the birds that sing. We thank you for everything."

Students at Guilderland High School near Albany, New York, sought to use an empty classroom for a voluntary prayer meeting room before class day began.

The Second Circuit Court of Appeals said "No" claiming it could be a bad influence on other students if they were "to see the captain of the football team or the student body president participation in communal (school) prayer meetings."

#### A Word from Heaven

Luke 18:1 declares that flesh will faint and become wearisome apart from prayer to God. All our children are made in God's divine image and should have a time to talk to the Heavenly Father.

How absurd and bizarre are our times when the First Amendment is invoked to allow Nazis and the Ku Klux Klan to march on public property and urge the extermination of Jews and the subjugation of blacks and yet prevents children from Bible study and prayer in public schools.

Solomon, the great King, declared: "The sacrifice of the wicked is an abomination to the Lord; but the prayer of the upright is his delight," Proverbs 15:8. The entire division of Psalms 5 relates to God honoring those who pray.

Permission for such school prayer exercises are urged through such Bible stands as I Timothy 2:1, Matthew 19:13-15, and Romans 13:1-4.

Permission for such exercises for those who want them is necessary if the schools are truly to be neutral in the matter of religion; and a refusal to permit students to pray is seen not as neutrality, but rather as the establishment of a religion of secularism.

Years ago, our daughter, Amber, was helping a friend clean house. She decided she would vacuum the living room and dining room. This was an old house, and those two areas were massive.

Determined to do a good job, she pulled the vacuum cleaner slowly over the carpet. After about 45 minutes of fastidious work, she had finished the living room and was halfway through the dining room.

Switching off the sweeper she turned to admire her work. She was shocked at the sight before her; dirt and debris were scattered all over her freshly swept carpet!

Glancing down at the sweeper, she saw the culprit. The hose that connects to the sweeper for vacuuming upholstery was still attached! As she diligently vacuumed, it sprayed all the rubbish on the carpet behind her! All her hard work was worthless!

Her ineffectual and futile attempt at cleaning reminded me of a vain and fruitless spirit among Christian's: PRIDE. When pride enters into our lives, not only does it make what we strive for worthless, but it makes a big mess too!

As I studied God's word, I found it astonishing and even frightening at the damage pride does to us and to those around us. If pride were rated as a spiritual disease, it would be in the top 10 killers. I'd like to share with you several of the destructive results of pride.

### Pride causes man to put himself above God

Men, today, are so full of themselves their hearts have no room for God. They tend overlook the fact that no one has ever been greater than Jesus.

Despite His greatness, He humbled himself to become but a mere man, take

all our filthy sins upon Him, and die a humiliating death to save us. How can man even begin to place himself above others, when the Kina of Kinas humbled himself to

die for even the most wretched sinner?!

Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:

But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men:

And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

Philippians 2:6-8

#### Pride causes man to rob God

### **Big Announcements from CBC**

Dr. Jeremy Langley Named President of Central Baptist College

Dr. Jeremy Langley has been appointed as the next president of Central Baptist College, the institution's Board of Trustees announced last week. Langley assumed the role on May 27, becoming the tenth president in the college's 73-year history.

Langley brings more than two decades of combined experience in higher education, ministry, and leadership to the position. He has served as CBC's executive vice president since August 2024.

Before arriving in Conway, he spent more than a decade as the associate pastor of Brister Baptist Church in Emerson and seven years in various roles at Southern Arkansas University, including assistant to the president, associate director of athletics, and assistant director of development.

"Speaking for the entire CBC board, we are thrilled to name Dr. Jeremy Langley as the new President of Central Baptist College," said Kirk Shelton, Board Chairman.

"Our search began over a year ago with the announcement of President Kimbrow's planned retirement this year. We believe that God brought Dr. Langley to us, and as one board member said, 'he checked all the boxes and exceeded our expectations.'

Dr. Langley hit the ground running working alongside President Kimbrow last fall and has developed a great relationship with administration, faculty, and staff. I believe he is the right man in

the right place at the right time."

Langley holds a Doctor of Ministry degree in Ministry Leadership from Liberty University, a Master of Arts in Pastoral Theology from the Baptist Missionary Association Theological Seminary, a Master of Public Administration from Southern Arkansas University, and a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and Mass Communications from Ouachita Baptist University.

He formerly served as a Justice of the Peace on the Columbia County Quorum Court, where he chaired the Court's finance committee.

"I am honored to accept the call to serve as president of Central Baptist College," Langley said.

"This institution has a rich legacy of preparing students for lives of service grounded in biblical truth. I look forward to building on that legacy and leading the college into a season of growth and impact. My chief goal is to ensure CBC continues to be a place where Christ is exalted and God is glorified."

Langley succeeds Terry Kimbrow, who retired May 26 after more than 20 years as president.

### Duffy Guyton Named Vice President for Advancement

Central Baptist College has announced the promotion of Duffy Guyton to Vice President for Advancement, effective July 1, 2025.

In this role, Guyton will lead the

college's advancement operations, including fundraising, church relations and donor engagement. He brings to the position a diverse background in development, ministry, and higher education leadership.

"I am excited to appoint Duffy to this key leadership position," said CBC President Dr. Jeremy Langley "He is widely respected on the CBC campus and among the churches of the Baptist Missionary Association.

His dedication to Christ-centered education and his ability to connect with donors, churches and alumni make him uniquely qualified to help advance our mission."

Guyton has served at CBC since 2017 when he joined the institution as Director of Church Relations and as the pitching coach for the CBC Mustangs baseball program.

"It is both a great honor and deeply humbling to be considered for this position," Guyton said. I am passionate about leading others in the area of biblical generosity, grounded in respect, honor, and through a heart of shepherding."

A former minor league pitcher with the St. Louis Cardinal organization, Guyton began his work in higher education at Dallas Baptist University where he served as a coach and Director of Athletic Fundraising.

He has served churches in Arkansas, Tennessee, Mississippi, and Texas in various pastoral roles.

Guyton is also involved in several

The fear of the LORD is to hate evil: pride, and arrogancy, and the evil way, Proverbs 8:13

To eliminate pride in our lives, we must humble ourselves and bow down. Then God is the one lifting us up, not ourselves.

So next time you sense yourself puffing up with visions of your own grandeur and importance, just remember:

Even a donkey saw an angel! (Read Numbers 22:23-33)
