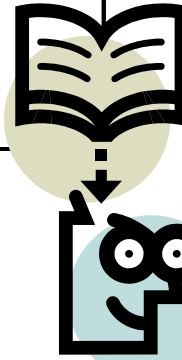

"That Reminds Me"

"Knowledge"



A very wise person once said even the most intelligent of us is unintelligent in some areas of life. I've found that to be truth.

However, those who don't recognize this truth often look down on others who are less gifted than they in certain areas.

That reminds me of the story about Christopher Columbus and one of his critics. Columbus was being honored for his discovery of America.

One of his critics said he didn't understand why everyone thought Columbus' journey was so remarkable. After all, many others were routinely making that journey at the time.

In response Columbus asked him if he could make a boiled egg stand on end.

"No one can do that!" declared the critic.

Columbus took a boiled egg and struck the end against the table, flattening the end. He then declared, "Anyone can do something, once they've been shown HOW."

One time our church was building an addition onto our facilities. I was working beside a professional carpenter. I was amazed at his skill and knowledge. I was impressed that, although he measured each piece before cutting it, he already knew the proper place to cut without measuring.

I told him, "Brother, I wish I knew as much about carpentry as you do." He stopped dead in his tracks, gave me a long look, and with tears in his eyes humbled me with this statement.

"Brother, I would give all my knowledge of carpentry to know as much about the Bible as you do."

While such a statement appealed to my pride and ego, I knew there was still a lot I didn't know about the Bible. But I've never forgotten the overwhelming

awareness of responsibility that swept over me when he said that.

He was correct that knowledge of God's Word is like the Pearl of Great Price of Mathew 13:45-56 which Jesus said the man sold all he had in order to buy.

However, knowledge of the Word of God is not to be the final result. Seemingly the greatest goal we could have in life would be to know all we could about the Word of God, but along with the gaining of knowledge is the great responsibility to share it with others.

Along with the responsibility to share though comes the responsibility to share it responsibly.

James declared, "My brethren, be not many masters, knowing that we shall receive the greater condemnation."

Literally, James has declared we teachers will be judged by a higher standard and with greater severity than other people, so we assume the greater accountability and the more condemnation.

The Apostle Paul declared in 2 Timothy 2:15, "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth."

If the word of truth can be rightly divided, it can also be wrongly divided. There is much religious confusion in the world today.

Most of it comes from the religious leaders of our day who have, and are still, wrongly dividing the word of truth. Many do it intentionally in order to teach their errors and misconceptions about what the Word of God actually declares.

Like the Scribes and Pharisees of Jesus' day, the mislead their followers, making them "two-foal more a child of hell than they themselves." Mathew 23:15
